A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – Baltimore City – P.R.O.T.E.C.T.**
3 **(Public Resources Organizing to End Crime Together) Program**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain employees of the Department of State Police to
5 enforce certain motor vehicle laws within Baltimore City; establishing the
6 P.R.O.T.E.C.T. (Public Resources Organizing to End Crime Together) Program for a
7 certain purpose; requiring the Department of State Police, the Division of Parole and
8 Probation, and the Department of Juvenile Services to establish and operate a
9 warrant apprehension task force partnership; requiring the Baltimore Police
10 Department, the Department of Juvenile Services, and the Division of Parole and
11 Probation to establish and operate certain district officer supervision teams;
12 requiring the Department of State Police to extend its jurisdiction for traffic control
13 and accident investigations into certain highways and streets in Baltimore City, as
14 specified by the Baltimore Police Commissioner in consultation with the Secretary
15 of State Police; requiring that the Baltimore City Juvenile Booking facility and the
16 Baltimore Detention Center be staffed by the Department of Juvenile Services and
17 the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services, respectively; prohibiting
18 Baltimore Police Department sworn officers from being used to staff the Baltimore
19 City Juvenile Booking facility or the Baltimore Detention Center; requiring the
20 Department of State Police, the Baltimore Police Department, the Department of
21 Juvenile Services, and the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to
22 make certain efforts to fully implement this Act at a certain time; authorizing the
23 Department of State Police, the Baltimore Police Department, the Department of
24 Juvenile Services, and the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to
25 adopt certain regulations; requiring the Governor’s Office of Crime Control and
26 Prevention and the Department of State Police to select certain high-crime
27 micro-zones within the State and create certain coordinator positions; providing for
28 the requirements and duties of a certain coordinator; mandating that the Governor
29 include certain appropriations in the annual budget bill each year; requiring the
30 Department of State Police, Baltimore City, the Department of Juvenile Services,
31 the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services, and the Governor’s Office

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Public Safety**

18 2–412.

19 (c) Police employees may not act within the limits of a municipal corporation that
20 maintains a police force except:

21 (1) when in pursuit of a criminal or suspect;

22 (2) when in search of a criminal or suspect wanted for a crime committed
23 outside of the limits of the municipal corporation or when interviewing or seeking to
24 interview a witness or supposed witness to the crime;

25 (3) when a crime is committed in the presence of the police employee, and
26 the arrested party must be immediately transferred to the custody of the local law
27 enforcement agency;

28 (4) when requested to act by the chief executive officer or chief police officer
29 of the municipal corporation;

30 (5) when ordered by the Governor to act within the municipal corporation;

31 (6) when enforcing the motor vehicle laws of the State[, except in Baltimore
32 City;

33 (7) in Baltimore City, only when enforcing Title 23 of the Transportation
34 Article];

1 OPERATE A WARRANT APPREHENSION TASK FORCE PARTNERSHIP.

2 (C) THE BALTIMORE POLICE DEPARTMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF
3 JUVENILE SERVICES, AND THE DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION SHALL
4 ESTABLISH AND OPERATE COLLABORATIVE DISTRICT OFFICER SUPERVISION TEAMS
5 THAT PROVIDE INTENSIVE SUPERVISION, INCLUDING INCREASED HOME VISITS, OF
6 ADULT AND JUVENILE VIOLENT OFFENDERS.

7 (D) THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE SHALL EXTEND ITS JURISDICTION
8 FOR TRAFFIC PATROL AND ACCIDENT INVESTIGATIONS INTO HIGHWAYS AND
9 STREETS THAT SERVE AS SIGNIFICANT ENTRY AND EXIT CORRIDORS TO BALTIMORE
10 CITY, AS SPECIFIED BY THE BALTIMORE POLICE COMMISSIONER IN CONSULTATION
11 WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE POLICE.

12 (E) (1) THE BALTIMORE CITY JUVENILE BOOKING FACILITY AND THE
13 BALTIMORE DETENTION CENTER SHALL BE STAFFED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF
14 JUVENILE SERVICES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND
15 CORRECTIONAL SERVICES, RESPECTIVELY.

16 (2) BALTIMORE POLICE DEPARTMENT SWORN OFFICERS MAY NOT
17 BE USED TO STAFF THE BALTIMORE CITY JUVENILE BOOKING FACILITY OR THE
18 BALTIMORE DETENTION CENTER.

19 (F) THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE, THE BALTIMORE POLICE
20 DEPARTMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE SERVICES, AND THE DEPARTMENT
21 OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES:

22 (1) SHALL MAKE DILIGENT EFFORTS TO FULLY IMPLEMENT THE
23 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE; AND

24 (2) MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE
25 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

26 4-1502.

27 (A) THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION AND
28 THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE SHALL:

29 (1) SELECT 10 HIGH-CRIME MICRO-ZONES WITHIN THE STATE; AND

30 (2) CREATE AN "END THE VIOLENCE" P.R.O.T.E.C.T.
31 COORDINATOR POSITION FOR EACH HIGH-CRIME MICRO-ZONE.

1 (B) AN “END THE VIOLENCE” P.R.O.T.E.C.T. COORDINATOR SHALL
2 RESIDE IN THE JURISDICTION IN WHICH THE HIGH-CRIME MICRO-ZONE IS
3 LOCATED.

4 (C) AN “END THE VIOLENCE” P.R.O.T.E.C.T. COORDINATOR SHALL:

5 (1) ENSURE UTILIZATION OF ALL EXISTING CRIME PREVENTION
6 PROGRAMS AND GRANTS;

7 (2) COORDINATE COMMUNITY AND YOUTH PROGRAMS;

8 (3) ASSIST WITH COMMUNITY MOBILIZATION AND ACTIVITIES TO
9 RECLAIM PUBLIC SPACE;

10 (4) ASSIST WITH RAPID RESPONSE TO PUBLIC NUISANCES; AND

11 (5) COORDINATE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT WITH THE LOCAL LAW
12 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY WITH JURISDICTION IN THE HIGH-CRIME MICRO-ZONE.

13 4-1503.

14 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE
15 GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION:

16 (1) SUFFICIENT TO FULLY FUND THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 4-1501 OF
17 THIS SUBTITLE; AND

18 (2) OF AT LEAST \$500,000 IN ADDITION TO THE FUNDING REQUIRED
19 UNDER ITEM (1) OF THIS SECTION TO BE USED BY THE GOVERNOR’S OFFICE OF
20 CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION TO HIRE AND MANAGE “END THE VIOLENCE”
21 P.R.O.T.E.C.T. COORDINATORS ESTABLISHED UNDER § 4-1502 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

22 4-1504.

23 ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31 ANNUALLY, BEGINNING IN 2020, THE
24 DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE, BALTIMORE CITY, THE DEPARTMENT OF
25 JUVENILE SERVICES, THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL
26 SERVICES, AND THE GOVERNOR’S OFFICE OF CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION
27 SHALL EACH REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF
28 THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE PROGRESS
29 MADE IN IMPLEMENTING THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June
31 1, 2020.
