### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Health Services Initiative – Vision Care for Low–Income Children

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health, under certain circumstances, to establish a certain Health Services Initiative; requiring the Health 4  $\mathbf{5}$ Services Initiative to apply to certain individuals, require certain schools to provide 6 certain services, offer services from certain providers, and require the Department 7 to reimburse certain providers in a certain manner for certain services; requiring, on 8 or before a certain date, the Department to apply to the Centers for Medicare and 9 Medicaid Services for a State Health Plan amendment to implement a certain Health Services Initiative; and generally relating to a Health Services Initiative for vision 1011 care for low-income children in the State.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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### Article – Health – General

20 **15–150.** 

(A) IF AUTHORIZED UNDER FEDERAL LAW, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
ESTABLISH A HEALTH SERVICES INITIATIVE TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO VISION
SCREENINGS, EYE EXAMINATIONS, AND EYEGLASSES THROUGH COUNTY PROGRAMS
THAT DELIVER VISION SERVICES IN SCHOOLS.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before July 1, 2020, the 28 Maryland Department of Health shall apply to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid 29 Services for a State Health Plan amendment to implement a Health Services Initiative, as 30 authorized under 42 U.S.C. § 1397ee(a)(1)(d)(ii), to increase access for low-income children 31 to needed vision services and glasses in accordance with the requirements of this section. 1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 2 1, 2020.
