10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The Alice Ferguson Foundation (AFF) serves thousands of Maryland students each year at its environmental education campus located on a 330 acre working farm on the shores of the Potomac River. Through single day and overnight experiences AFF connects people to the natural world, sustainable agriculture practices, and the cultural heritage of their local watershed through education, demonstration, and stewardship. AFF enhances classroom curriculum for students by highlighting scientific, agricultural and ecological principles mapped to Next Generation Science Standards. Pre-K through 12th grade students explore the watershed, learn about food production, and investigate sustainability concepts. AFF also provides professional development opportunities for teachers to enhance their teaching skills. More information can be found at www.fergusonfoundation.org.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Earning its rightful place on the National Register of Historic Places, the Ferguson's Hard bargain Farm is a classic example of a Country place Era estate and is also one of the only turn-of-the-century artists residences still intact in Maryland. Renovation and repairs (both internal and external) for the main farmhouse and ancillary buildings are vital to preserving this important piece of history, which also serve as the main offices for the Foundation. AFF's property consists of more than 50 buildings of various sizes some of which are over a century old. The historic 1930s barnyard is central to the education of students and needs repairs in order to ensure the continued safety of all who use it. The farm's amphitheater is also in need of repairs including the replacement of retaining wall and installation of storm water management controls. Road repair, erosion controls, and tree management are also needed to ensure continued use for decades to come.
