#### **10. Description and Purpose of Organization** (Limit length to visible area)

Since 1976, Athelas Institute, Inc. has provided life skills training to maximize opportunities for individuals with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) in Howard County and throughout Maryland. Athelas Institute currently serves approximately 350 individuals in specialized day programs providing day habilitation, vocational and supported employment skills training as well as a full array of residential services provided in 18 homes. All Athelas programs focus on maintaining personal growth and promote community integration for people with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities. This project will allow Athelas to continue to provide safe, updated, accessible homes to meet the needs of these individuals.

### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The purpose of this project is to maintain, improve upon and provide safe, accessible homes for seven individuals with Intellectual/Developemental Disabilities who receive services and supports from Athelas Institute. One of the two homes identified for this project needed major renovations to improve safety, accessibility and long term use by those living there. This older home had asbestos siding, broken walkways, drafty doors and windows. The bathroom was original to the house and in bad condition. The four people living there were having issues with accessibility. The other home could not be licensed for use until a sprinkler system and septic changes were made, according to the Howard County Fire Marshall. Three individuals and six staff members are waiting to be able to live in this house.
