The CAP is a non-profit organization under the US Air Force. Initiated just before WW2, it served as anti submarine reconnaissance. Our mission is now (A) EMERGENCY SERVICES, SEARCH and RESCUE, disaster relief, home land security and other missions. (B) A Cadet program designed to provide character development and leadership opportunities to our youth 12-18 yrs of age. (C) We provide the nations leading Aerospace Education Program for our Cadets, which gets them enthusiastic about science, technology and math. Our squadron has three Sr. Member Engineers teaching rocketry. CAP with Air Force Assn are supporting Cyber Patriot and our skilled IT Pro's plan a Cyber Security Course.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Our current housing is a pair of FEMA donated discarded flooded trailers. The Squadron has grown from 4 Cadets to 35 and 14 Senior Members. Active recruiting has halted due to lack of space, but more young adults between 12 and 18 yrs of age are requesting membership to this organization. All applicants will be accepted as per organizational charter. We envision a single story 3000 sq.ft. building with 2 classrooms and various offices for operational needs, emergency radio communications room, pilot briefing room, Flight Simulator room and ADA approved Bathrooms with showers and a small food preparation area. The Classrooms may be combined or further separated to provide emergence "bunkrooms" for out-of-town members during search and rescue operations. The building will be constructed on the current site of the trailers.

28. Comments
Our composite Squadron, number 65, falls under the Maryland Wing of the Civil Air Patrol, a non-profit Organization (EIN 75-6037853). Our Mission is emergency Services, Search and Rescue. Due to the growth of our Squadron, we now qualify to have an airplane based at the Cumberland Airport, which will enhance that mission as well as support the second part of our mission, which is Aeronautical Education for our Cadets. Our current housing of 2 FEMA trailers is now failing our needs. The Maryland Wing supplies the Squadron with the needed equipment, its maintenance and operating expenses. This includes all vehicles, airplane, required maintenance, spares and fuel Our costs are for direct operation of the building. The proposed building will be used around 8-10 hrs weekly, so costs are minimal. Any outside use of the building will be covered by the organization using it. Our current income stream, made up entirely of corporate and individual donations as well as membership fees has thus far proven sufficient to sustain our operational needs and we see no decrease of future income. Our growth will cover future expense growth.
