The Baltimore County Dept. of Recreation and Parks is a public agency that provides a wide range of recreational opportunities to the citizens and visitors of the County, through hundreds of parks and recreation sites countywide. Recreational facilities are provided at parks, leased recreation sites, and public school recreation centers-- the latter through a joint-use agreement whereby many indoor and outdoor facilities at public schools are used for both educational and recreational purposes. The Department administers a wide range of parks, from countywide parks up to 1,100-acres in size, to small neighborhood "pocket parks" of less than an acre. The parks feature a wide variety of facilities and free-time recreational opportunities, and hundreds of organized recreation programs are provided through 45 non-profit recreation and parks councils formed by volunteers.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The proposed project consists of a variety of park renovations and improvements to Cromwell Valley Park, a 455-acre countywide park in the Loch Raven area of central Baltimore County. The park is home to one of Baltimore County's six interpretive centers, and dedicated primarily to natural resource-based forms of recreation, featuring over 7.5 miles of trails, horticultural therapy area, a children's garden, "hawk watch" area, restored lime kilns, scout camp area, and the Willow Grove Nature Center and associated facilities. A series of park renovations and enhancements are proposed, including but not limited to: an "Accessible Trail for All," nature pavilion, parking and access road enhancements, and renovations to the "barnatorium," where numerous programs are hosted. The renovations and enhancements are needed to support safe, quality public access to this extremely popular park.
