The mission of Dayspring, Inc. is to support and promote children's total development (spiritual/moral, intelllectual, social/emotional, and physical) and to assist them in being and becoming productive, giving members of society. Our goals are to improve education and schooling outcomes for the children of Baltimore and to develop programs that serve as models for educating children who have not traditionally had access to high-quality educational settings. The goal of the Dayspring project is to build a new education resource center where: \*Children in Park Heights have vital academic resources unavailable at their schools and that are accessible beyond the regular school day; \*Children receive the support that they need to achieve at high academic levels and develop attitudes and skills essential to success in school and in life; \*Students are challenged academically as they participate in rigorous, engaging, research-based programs; \*Children receive needed guidance that will help them grow socially, academically, and emotionally; \*Parents, teachers, and neighbors have access to resources that support children's education and development and improve the community; \*Students connect the knowledge and skills they are learning to life beyond school through authentic learning opportunities facilitated by subject matter experts; \*Dayspring's academic support programs become models for similar Baltimore communities.

## 28. Comments

Dayspring, Inc. was incorporated in March 1982 as a private, nonprofit organization. In September, 1982, Dayspring purchased and renovated a former florist shop and greenhouse (the former Jerry Geary Flowers) located on one acre in the Pimlico/Park Heights community and began year-round childcare, nursery, and kindergarten programs as well as summer programs for school-age children.

Dayspring operated it's state-approved early education and child care program from 1982 to 1996 serving more than 350 families in the Pimlico/Park Heights and surrounding communitities. However, Dayspring scaled back early childhood programs in the late 1990s in response to decreases in public funding of child care for poor families. In 2007, Dayspring launched Visions for Education (VFE) designed to provide children and youth with innovative, intellectually rigorous, high-quality learning settings that emphasize spiritual and moral development, academic achievement, family and community support for education, and research-based educational practices.

Funds from a bond bill were obtained in 2008 for Phase I of the VFE initiative. The funds were used to repair and update one of Dayspring's smaller buildings for use as an educational resource center that would provide afterschool and summer programs for students in grades 4 to 8. The Visions for Education Resource Center offered programs in website creation and development, coding, mural painting, homework support, performing arts, and fine arts and also provided resources for parents and teachers as well as an Internet Hot-Spot for the community. The 2008 bond bill funds were also used to design and develop construction drawings for a new facility to replace the former 8500 sq. ft. child care center on Dayspring's one-acre property.

Our goal in obtaining additional bond bill funding this year is to begin Phase II of the VFE initiative which will involve submitting our construction drawings to Baltimore City Planning and securing the remaining funds required to begin construction by January 2021. Dayspring has already obtained a \$25,000 grant from Healthy Neighborhoods, Inc. to demolish the former child care center building on Dayspring's campus. Bond bill funds will also be used to install new electric and air-conditioning service to the 1278 sq. ft. building which houses Dayspring's administrative offices and the Visions for Education Resource Center (see Item 27 and Item 28 of this Fact Sheet).
