10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The Goshen Farm Preservation Society, Inc. is a 501(c)3 corporations whose purpose is to preserve, protect, and promote the unique historical aspects of the Goshen Farm for historical and educational purposes. The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes, Since March 2015, Goshen Farm has been visited by an estimated 3,000 students, volunteers, and residents who have attended educational and demonstration programs, clean-up workdays, open houses, summer concerts, and other events. These activities, along with the working of the 62 Sharing Garden plots, has made Goshen Farm a hub of community activities and gatherings. Goshen Farm supports educational programs at Broadneck, Southern, and Annapolis High Schools, Cape St. Claire E.S. and the St. Andrew by the Bay Summer Camp.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The purpose of the project is to stabilize the foundation of the Goshen Farm House. Built in 1783, the house is on the the Maryland Inventory of Historic Properies AA-339. The stabilization of the foundation will allow the Society to move forward with preservation efforts and make the house more accessible to the public and Anne Arundel County Public Schools students and students from other schools. Goshen Farm is currently working with a Professional Engineer, David Wallace, and an architectural designer, to fully determine the best way to proceed. We would like Mr. Wallace to lay out the needed repairs and then help us develop a Request for Proposals that would drive the vendor selection process. The funding is strictly for the capital project discussed above. None of the money will be used for funding the organization. Some of the funds may be used for Mr. Wallace or another qualified individual to serve as project director/construction supervisor.

At the February 19, 2020 meeting of the Board of Education, on a motion by Robert C. Leib, member representing Districts 30A and 30B, the Board voted unanimously to support a resolution supporting the Goshen Farm Preservation Society's Bond Initiative.					
The money received under the previous Bond Bill in 2012 was used for lead abatement and mold remediation. The total cost of these projects was approximately \$150,000 and they had to be completed before and stabilization and restoration could be initiated.
