In 2019, Randallstown Islamic Community Learning Center was formally registered with the State of Maryland as a non-profit community development corporation. The Randallstown Islamic Community draws it membership from mostly the middle class and majority of the adults earned a college degree. The mission includes providing charity services aimed at improving the social and economic life of members and non-members living around Randallstown, Windsor Mill and other communities of Baltimore County.

28. Comments

The community has several years of experience in program planning, development and evaluation. The community also has a track record of raising funds through membership contribution and fundraisers. The act of volunteering and the zeal to contribute to community development is the driving force for the project.

The communities to benefit from the project currently struggle with issues of sluggish rising students grades, low computer Information Technology literacy rate, and low physical activity levels when compared to other communities in Maryland. The goal of the proposed community learning center is to facilitate improvements in those metrics. Benefits of the project can be viewed from the following rationale.

Research has shown that good afterschool programs do not only improve academic performance but also influence school-day attendance, even when most dont appear to make it an intentional goal. The program can facilitate socialization and peer attention in a supervised environment; and help engage students in challenging activities that help them develop persistence, a trait critical to later success in school and life.

To succeed in the increasingly digital world, computer Information Technology knowledge and skills are needed to navigate challenges of public service, and decent paying jobs. The ability to create and maintain spreadsheets in Microsoft Excel, skills of Word and PowerPoint, or secure computer Information Technology could be a differentiator on job hunt and success in career.

The community learning center will include a recreational facility for sports and for community meetings. The sports complex does not only benefit the community by helping the physical wellbeing, but also create a less stressed mind which facilitates overall happiness. The center will help bridge cultural differences and improve community relations resulting from group activities that help increase cohesion in the community. Physical activities performed in the center will also be beneficial in reducing the rising cases of obesity and other chronic conditions.
