The United States Lighthouse Society is a nonprofit historical and educational organization dedicated to saving and sharing the rich maritime legacy of American lighthouses and supporting lighthouse preservation throughout the nation. The USLHS provides public tours from the Annapolis Maritime Museum to the lighthouse during the summer for educational purposes. In addition, preservationists maintain the lighthouse cottage both inside and out, and Docents are trained by members of the Chesapeake Chapter of the USLHS at the Annapolis Maritime Museum.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The project consists of replacement of the "knees and joints" of the lighthouse. These elements contain steel beams and steel tie rods that are in poor condition. There are 12 beams, 11 of which are being replaced and 24 tie rods, of which 20 are being replaced. In addition, the understructure will receive a coat of paint. The landing deck will be replaced after the steel beams under the deck are replaced. The steel beams and tie rods will have a life expectancy of 40 to 60 years, thus ensuring the Thomas Point Shoal lighthouse continues as a National Historic Landmark.

## 28. Comments

The Thomas Point Lighthouse was built in 1875. It has been a beacon on the bay keeping boaters safe from the Thomas Point Shoal. This iconic lighthouse is the last surviving screw pile lighthouse on the Chesapeake Bay, and has been a Historic National Landmark since 1999.

The lighthouse was transferred to the City of Annapolis, the United States Lighthouse Society and the Annapolis Maritime Museum in 2004. The Chesapeake Chapter of the United States Lighthouse Society has managed the renovation, and countless volunteers have renovated the exterior and interior of the structure to pre-1939 conditions.

The U.S. Lighthouse Society, in cooperation with the Annapolis Maritime Museum, conducts tours of the lighthouse for the public throughout the summer. Each tour is led by trained and experienced docents and involves a 30-minute boat ride to gain access to the lighthouse.

The structure of the lighthouse is showing severe deterioration, and a contractor has been selected to complete a major restoration of the steel beams and tie rods that hold up the cottage style lighthouse. Once completed, the steel understructure should have a continued life expectancy of 40 to 60 years.
