Anne Arundel County - Alcoholic Beverages - Board of License Commissioners Staff and Compensation

This bill requires the Anne Arundel County Board of License Commissioners to employ one full-time executive director and one full-time administrator and specifies the pay grades for these positions. In addition, the bill increases, from one to two, the number of full-time secretaries the board must employ. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2020.**

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Senate Bill 221

Local Effect: Anne Arundel County expenditures increase by \$81,500 in FY 2021 and by \$86,000 in FY 2025. Anne Arundel County revenues are not affected.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The board may employ *up to* two full-time administrators, one part-time chief inspector, one part-time deputy chief inspector, 18 part-time inspectors, and other clerical and other assistants as necessary.

In addition, the board is required to employ one full-time secretary and one salaried attorney. The board may also employ one contractual attorney when the attorney employed by the board is unable to perform because of conflict of interest.

Local Fiscal Effect: Anne Arundel expenditures increase by an estimated \$81,453 in fiscal 2021 and \$86,049 in fiscal 2025. The bill adds one new secretary position and reclassifies an existing administrator position as an executive director.
