AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 676

(First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 10, after “staff;” insert “requiring a certain school implementing a virtual education day to establish a method for sending and receiving certain assignments for students who lack Internet access;”; and in line 14, after “circumstances;” insert “providing that a virtual education day will reduce by a certain number of days the number of days incorporated into the school’s calendar for a certain purpose; prohibiting the county superintendent from ordering a virtual education day in a certain school year under certain circumstances;”.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, in line 2, strike “**THE**” and substitute “**SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION, THE**”; and after line 22, insert:

“(3) A SCHOOL IMPLEMENTING A VIRTUAL EDUCATION DAY SHALL ESTABLISH A METHOD FOR SENDING ASSIGNMENTS TO STUDENTS AND FOR RECEIVING COMPLETED ASSIGNMENTS FROM STUDENTS WHO LACK INTERNET ACCESS.”

On page 3, after line 1, insert:

“(F) (1) IF THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT ORDERS A VIRTUAL EDUCATION DAY, THE VIRTUAL EDUCATION DAY WILL REDUCE BY 1 DAY THE NUMBER OF DAYS INCORPORATED IN THE SCHOOL’S CALENDAR FOR SCHOOL CLOSURES DUE TO SEVERE WEATHER OR OTHER EMERGENCIES IN THE SCHOOL YEAR.”

(Over)

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**(2) IF THERE ARE NO DAYS IN A SCHOOL'S CALENDAR FOR SCHOOL CLOSURES DUE TO SEVERE WEATHER OR OTHER EMERGENCIES IN THE SCHOOL YEAR REMAINING IN A SCHOOL YEAR, THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT MAY NOT ORDER A VIRTUAL EDUCATION DAY FOR THE SCHOOL IN THE SCHOOL YEAR.**

On page 3, in line 2, strike “(F)” and substitute “(G)”.
