# A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 Vehicle Laws – Injury or Death of Vulnerable Individual – Penalties

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an individual from causing the serious physical injury or 4 death of a vulnerable individual as a result of the individual operating a vehicle in  $\mathbf{5}$ violation of certain provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law; establishing certain 6 penalties for a violation of this Act; establishing that an individual charged with a 7 violation of this Act must appear in court and may not prepay the fine; requiring the 8 Motor Vehicle Administration to suspend for a certain amount of time the driver's 9 license of an individual convicted of a violation of this Act; defining the term 10 "vulnerable individual" for purposes of this Act; and generally relating to penalties 11 for causing the serious physical injury or death of a vulnerable individual.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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1 (B) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT CAUSE THE SERIOUS PHYSICAL INJURY OR 2 DEATH OF A VULNERABLE INDIVIDUAL AS A RESULT OF THE INDIVIDUAL OPERATING 3 A MOTOR VEHICLE IN VIOLATION OF ANY PROVISION OF THIS TITLE.

4 (C) (1) AN INDIVIDUAL CHARGED WITH A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (B) 5 OF THIS SECTION:

- 6 (I) MUST APPEAR IN COURT; AND

- (II) MAY NOT PREPAY THE FINE.

8 (2) AN INDIVIDUAL CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (B) 9 OF THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$2,000.

10 (D) IN ADDITION TO THE PENALTIES PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF 11 THIS SECTION, THE COURT MAY ORDER AN INDIVIDUAL CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION 12 OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION TO:

- 13 (1) PARTICIPATE IN A MOTOR VEHICLE SAFETY COURSE; AND
- 14 (2) **PERFORM UP TO 150 HOURS OF COMMUNITY SERVICE.**

15 (E) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL SUSPEND THE DRIVER'S LICENSE OF AN 16 INDIVIDUAL CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION FOR 17 AT LEAST 7 DAYS BUT NOT MORE THAN 6 MONTHS.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 October 1, 2021.
