BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Finance and Procurement Section 7–213 Annotated Code of Maryland (2015 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - State Finance and Procurement
