- 28 (1) establish guidelines to assist businesses with complying with the 29 provisions of this Act, including guidelines for estimating the weight of the food residuals 30 generated by a business;
- 31 (2) develop mapping and other systems to identify existing composting 32 facilities and the geographic areas within the 30-mile radius of each facility;

17	2023, the Department of Commerce shall report to the General Assembly, in accordance

19	incentives to encourage food waste reduction and composting in the State.
20	SECTION 6. 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
21	October 1, 2021.
