BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article - Education Section 18-3001 and 18-3005 Annotated Code of Maryland (2018 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Education** 18-3001. (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. Be a student enrolled at a public or private nonprofit 19 institution of higher education outside the State, if the student graduated from a high school in the State; and 2021 Maintain a cumulative [3.0] **2.5** grade point average on a 224.0 scale each academic year; or 23Have been honorably discharged from the United States 24armed forces, the National Guard, or a reserve component of the United States armed forces 25within 18 months of the date of application; 26 2. Be a resident of Maryland; and 273. Have graduated from a public or private nonprofit 28 institution of higher education; 29 (2) Commit to working a minimum of 120 hours during a spring, fall, or 30 summer semester;

Attend an orientation session provided or approved by UMBC; and

Meet any other criteria established by UMBC.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 2 $\,$ 1, 2021.
