1 AN ACT concerning

2 Vehicle Laws – Intersections – Prohibited Acts

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting a vehicle from entering certain intersections when facing certain traffic signals if the vehicle is unable to completely proceed through the intersection; establishing certain exceptions to the prohibition; prohibiting a police officer from issuing a citation for a violation of this Act unless certain conditions are met; making conforming changes; and generally relating to prohibited acts by vehicles at intersections.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article - Transportation

- 17 21–202.
- 18 (a) (1) Except for special pedestrian signals that carry a legend, where traffic 19 is controlled by traffic control signals that show different colored lights or colored lighted 20 arrows, whether successively one at a time or in combination, only the colors green, red,
- 21 and yellow may be used.
- 22 (2) These lights apply to drivers and pedestrians as provided in this
- 23 section.

- 2**HOUSE BILL 311** [Vehicular] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (M) OF THIS SECTION, VEHICULAR 1 2 traffic facing a circular green signal may proceed straight through or, unless a sign at the 3 place prohibits the turn, turn right or left. 4 Vehicular traffic described under subsection (b) of this section, including any (c) 5 vehicle turning right or left, shall yield the right-of-way to any other vehicle and any 6 pedestrian lawfully within the intersection or an adjacent crosswalk when the signal is 7 shown. 8 (d) [Vehicular] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (M) OF THIS SECTION, VEHICULAR traffic facing a green arrow signal, whether shown alone or with another indication, 9 10 cautiously may enter the intersection, but only to make the movement indicated by the 11 arrow or to make another movement permitted by other indications shown at the same 12 time.
- 13 (e) Vehicular traffic described under subsection (d) of this section shall yield the 14 right–of–way to any pedestrian or bicycle lawfully within an adjacent crosswalk and to any 15 other traffic lawfully using the intersection.
- 16 (f) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal as provided in § 21–203 of this subtitle, a pedestrian facing any green signal, unless the green signal is only a turn arrow, may cross the roadway, within any marked or unmarked crosswalk, in the direction of the green signal.
- 20 (g) (1) Vehicular traffic facing a steady yellow signal is warned that the 21 related green movement is ending or that a red signal, which will prohibit vehicular traffic 22 from entering the intersection, will be shown immediately after the yellow signal.
 - (2) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal as provided in § 21–203 of this subtitle, a pedestrian facing a steady yellow signal is warned that there is not enough time to cross the roadway before a red signal is shown, and a pedestrian may not then start to cross the roadway.
- 27 (h) (1) Vehicular traffic facing a steady circular red signal alone:
 - (i) Shall stop at the near side of the intersection:
- 29 1. At a clearly marked stop line;

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
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- 30 2. If there is no clearly marked stop line, before entering any 31 crosswalk; or
- 32 3. If there is no crosswalk, before entering the intersection; 33 and
- 34 (ii) Except as provided in subsections (i), (j), and (k) of this section, 35 shall remain stopped until a signal to proceed is shown.



- 1 (2) (I) A VEHICLE THAT IS MAKING A LEFT TURN WHEN FACING A
 2 CIRCULAR GREEN SIGNAL MAY ENTER THE INTERSECTION WHILE YIELDING THE
 3 RIGHT-OF-WAY TO ANY OTHER VEHICLE THAT IS APPROACHING FROM THE
 4 OPPOSITE DIRECTION OR TO A PEDESTRIAN.
- 5 (II) A VEHICLE THAT IS MAKING A RIGHT TURN MAY ENTER THE 6 INTERSECTION WHILE YIELDING THE RIGHT-OF-WAY TO A PEDESTRIAN OR A 7 BICYCLIST.
- 8 (3) A POLICE OFFICER MAY NOT ISSUE A CITATION FOR A VIOLATION 9 OF THIS SUBSECTION UNLESS:
- 10 (I) THE APPROACH TO THE INTERSECTION HAS APPROPRIATE
 11 SIGNS INSTALLED THAT NOTIFY THE PUBLIC THAT A VEHICLE MAY NOT MAKE A
 12 MOVEMENT AT THE INTERSECTION THAT VIOLATES THIS SUBSECTION; AND
- (II) THE SIGNS ARE INSTALLED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
 MANUAL AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR A UNIFORM SYSTEM OF TRAFFIC CONTROL
 DEVICES ADOPTED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION UNDER § 25–104 OF
 THIS ARTICLE.
- [(m)] (N) Except for those provisions of this section that by their very nature cannot apply, this section applies to a traffic control signal placed at a location other than an intersection. Each stop required by the signal shall be made at a sign or marking on the pavement indicating where the stop shall be made or, if there is no sign or marking, at the signal.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2021.
