Plastic Bag Reduction Act

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting, on or after a certain date, a certain retail establishment 4 from distributing plastic carryout bags to a customer at the point of sale; providing 5 that, on or after a certain date, only the State may enact a law or take other action 6 to prohibit, restrict, or regulate the use of certain plastic bags by a retail 7 establishment, that certain authority of a county or municipality is preempted, and 8 that certain laws or ordinances are superseded; establishing a certain maximum civil 9 penalty for a violation of this Act; establishing that the distribution of a certain 10 number of plastic carryout bags at a single point of sale constitutes a single violation; 11 prohibiting the imposition of a penalty under this Act unless certain conditions are 12 met; authorizing a unit of county government to grant a certain waiver under certain 13 circumstances; providing for the enforcement of this Act; prohibiting a county or 14 municipality from adopting or enforcing a certain law or ordinance unless certain 15 conditions are met; requiring the Maryland Department of Labor to adopt certain 16 regulations; defining certain terms; and generally relating to carryout bags.

- 15 FACILITY, OR ANY OTHER ESTABLISHMENT THAT PROVIDES BAGS TO ITS
- 16 CUSTOMERS AS A RESULT OF THE SALE OF A PRODUCT.
- 17 (B) ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2022, A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT MAY NOT
- 18 PROVIDE A PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG TO A CUSTOMER.
- 19 (C) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, A RETAIL
- 20 ESTABLISHMENT THAT VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY
- 21 **NOT EXCEEDING \$500.**
- 22 (D) (1) THE PROVISION OF ONE OR MORE PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAGS AT A
- 23 SINGLE POINT OF SALE IS A SINGLE VIOLATION.
- 24 (2) A PENALTY MAY NOT BE IMPOSED UNDER THIS SECTION UNLESS
- 25 A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT:
- 26 (I) IS FIRST ISSUED A WRITTEN NOTICE OF VIOLATION; AND
- 27 (II) DOES NOT CORRECT THE VIOLATION WITHIN 3 MONTHS
- 28 AFTER RECEIPT OF THE WRITTEN NOTICE.
- 29 (3) A PENALTY MAY NOT BE IMPOSED ON A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT

- 1 (E) (1) THIS SECTION SHALL BE ENFORCED BY THE APPROPRIATE UNIT 2 OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT.
- 3 (2) A UNIT OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT MAY GRANT A RETAIL
- 4 ESTABLISHMENT UP TO TWO WAIVERS FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION
- 5 FOR A PERIOD OF UP TO 3 MONTHS FOR EACH WAIVER IF THE UNIT OF COUNTY

- 18 (3) THIS SECTION SUPERSEDES ANY LAW OR ORDINANCE OF A
- 19 COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY THAT PROHIBITS, RESTRICTS, OR REGULATES THE USE
- 20 OF PLASTIC BAGS LESS THAN 4 MILS THICK BY A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT.

- 23 ADOPT OR ENFORCE A LAW OR AN ORDINANCE THAT REQUIRES A RETAIL
- 24 ESTABLISHMENT TO CHARGE AND COLLECT A FEE, A TAX, OR ANY OTHER CHARGE
- 25 FOR THE USE OF CARRYOUT BAGS AT THE POINT OF SALE UNLESS THE LAW OR
- 26 ORDINANCE IS AUTHORIZED BY A STATE LAW ENACTED ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1,
- 27 **2022.**
- 28 (2) WITH RESPECT TO A COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY THAT, ON OR
- 29 BEFORE FEBRUARY 1, 2021, ADOPTED A LAW OR AN ORDINANCE THAT REQUIRES A
- 30 RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT TO CHARGE AND COLLECT A FEE, A TAX, OR ANY OTHER
- 31 CHARGE FOR THE USE OF CARRYOUT BAGS AT THE POINT OF SALE, THIS
