CHAPTER

AN ACT concerning 1

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Commission on Student Behavioral Health and Mental Health Treatment

- FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on Student Behavioral Health and Mental 4 Health Treatment; providing for the purpose, composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission; prohibiting a member of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Commission to study and make recommendations on certain matters regarding student behavioral health and mental health treatment; requiring the Commission to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor, the State Board of Education, and the General Assembly on or before certain dates; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Commission on Student Behavioral Health and Mental Health Treatment.
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 13 14 That:
- 15 (a) There is a Commission on Student Behavioral Health and Mental Health 16 Treatment.
- 17 The purpose of the Commission is to study, evaluate, update, and revise (b) 18 guidelines for student behavioral health and mental health treatment and practices in 19 general, and including school-based health centers.

5 6 7 8	(2) investigate the unique behavioral health needs of students from different racial and ethnic backgrounds dealing with behavioral health and mental health issues, including differences by student racial and ethnic background in the provision of behavioral health services, scope of practice, types of service, and duration of treatment;		
9 10 11 12	(2) (3) make recommendations on actions necessary to improve the current practices of student behavioral health treatment, including actions specific to improvements for students who belong to racial and ethnic minority groups and improvements for service from school-based health centers;		
13 14	(3) (4) revise guidelines for student behavioral health treatment and practices in school–based health centers; and		
15 16 17	(4) (5) research ways to coordinate school-based practices with health care provider practices to improve treatment available for students who need behavioral health or mental health treatment.		
18 19 20 21	(g) On or before December 1, 2021 <u>July 1, 2022</u> , and December 1, 2022, the Commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor, the <u>State Board of Education</u> , and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.		
22 23 24 25	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2021. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2023, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
