BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Health – General Section 19–1805(a)(8) and (9) Annotated Code of Maryland (2019 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement) BY adding to Article – Health – General Section $\frac{19-1805(e)}{19-1805(a)(10)}$

33	2022, the Maryland Department of Health shall:

(1) convene interested stakeholders to make revisions to the regulations for Assisted Living Programs (COMAR 10.07.14) using the draft dated September 30, 2016,
as the starting point for discussion; and
(2) adopt revised regulations for assisted living programs that incorporate the requirements for Alzheimer's special care units as enacted under Section 1 of this Act.
SECTION $\stackrel{2}{=}$ 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October July 1, 2021.
