

5 6 7 8 9	FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Montgomery County to issue a refillable container permit for draft beer or a nonrefillable container permit for draft beer to a holder of a Class H beer and wine license if the licensed establishment is in Damascus; making clarifying changes; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Montgomery County.

- 1 There is a refillable container permit. (a) 2 A refillable container permit authorizes the permit holder to: (b) 3 sell draft beer for off-premises consumption in a refillable container 4 that meets the standards set out in subsection (d) of this section; and sell and refill a refillable container that meets the standards set out in 5 (2)6 subsection (d) of this section. 7 The term of a refillable container permit is the same as that of the (c) underlying license. 8 9 (2)The hours of sale for a refillable container permit are the same as those for the underlying license. 10 11 An applicant who holds an underlying license without an off-sale 12privilege shall meet the same advertising, posting of notice, and public hearing 13 requirements as those for the underlying license. To be used as a refillable container for beer under the authority of a 14 (d) refillable container permit, a container shall: 15 16 (i) have a capacity of not less than 32 ounces and not more than 128 17 ounces; 18 be sealable: (ii) 19 be branded with an identifying mark of the seller of the (iii) 20 container; 21bear the federal health warning statement required for (iv) containers of alcoholic beverages under 27 C.F.R. 16.21; 2223 display instructions for cleaning the container; and (v) 24 (vi) bear a label stating that: 25 1. cleaning the container is the responsibility of the 26 consumer; and 27 2. the contents of the container are perishable and should be 28 refrigerated immediately and consumed within 48 hours after purchase.
- 29 (2) The Comptroller may adopt standards regarding containers that 30 qualify for use as refillable containers for beer, including containers originating from 31 outside the State.

(e) 25-1104.1. 17 18 (a) The Board may issue a nonrefillable container permit for draft beer to a holder 19 of: 20 **(1)** a Class B beer and wine license [,]; 21**(2)** a Class D beer and wine license [, or]; 22**(3)** a Class BD-BWL license; OR 23 IF THE LICENSED PREMISES IS IN DAMASCUS (12TH ELECTION **(4)** DISTRICT), IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 25–1603 OF THIS TITLE, A CLASS H BEER AND 2425 WINE LICENSE.
- 26 (b) An applicant for the permit shall complete the form that the Board provides.

- 1 (c) The hours of sale for the permit begin and end at the same time as those for 2 the underlying license. 3 (d) The permit may be renewed each year with the renewal of the underlying license. 4 5 (e) The Board shall issue the permit at no cost to the applicant. 6 25–1603. 7 (a) This section applies only to Damascus (12th election district). 8 The Board may issue a 7-day Class C (on-sale) beer, wine, and liquor license (b) to a volunteer fire department. 9 10 (c) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection: 11 (i) the Board may issue Class H beer and wine, hotel and restaurant 12 licenses; and 13 (ii) the licenses may be renewed or transferred. 14 (2) A license may be issued, transferred, or renewed if: pool tables, billiard tables, shuffleboards, dart boards, video 15 (i) 16 games, pinball machines, or recreational devices are not used in the licensed premises; and 17 (ii) **EXCEPT** FOR **BEER** IN **CONTAINERS** SOLD **FOR** 18 OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION AS AUTHORIZED UNDER SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS 19 SECTION, alcoholic beverages served by the license holder are consumed by customers while the customers are seated. 20 THE BOARD MAY ISSUE TO THE HOLDER OF A CLASS H BEER AND WINE 21(D) 22 LICENSE: 23**(1)** A REFILLABLE CONTAINER PERMIT FOR DRAFT BEER UNDER § 2425–1103 OF THIS TITLE; OR 25**(2)** A NONREFILLABLE CONTAINER PERMIT FOR DRAFT BEER UNDER 26§ 25–1104.1 OF THIS TITLE.
- 27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 28 1, 2021.
