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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Procedure – Sexual Offenders – Lifetime Supervision**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a sentence for certain persons convicted of certain sexual  
4 abuse crimes to include a term of lifetime sexual offender supervision; providing for  
5 the application of this Act; and generally relating to sexual offender supervision.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Criminal Law**

19 3–602.

- 1 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 2 (2) “Family member” has the meaning stated in § 3–601 of this subtitle.
- 3 (3) “Household member” has the meaning stated in § 3–601 of this subtitle.
- 4 (4) (i) “Sexual abuse” means an act that involves sexual molestation or  
5 exploitation of a minor, whether physical injuries are sustained or not.
- 6 (ii) “Sexual abuse” includes:
- 7 1. incest;
- 8 2. rape;
- 9 3. sexual offense in any degree; and
- 10 4. unnatural or perverted sexual practices.
- 11 (b) (1) A parent or other person who has permanent or temporary care or  
12 custody or responsibility for the supervision of a minor may not cause sexual abuse to the  
13 minor.
- 14 (2) A household member or family member may not cause sexual abuse to  
15 a minor.
- 16 (c) A person who violates this section is guilty of a felony and on conviction is  
17 subject to imprisonment not exceeding 25 years.
- 18 (d) A sentence imposed under this section may be separate from and consecutive  
19 to or concurrent with a sentence for:
- 20 (1) any crime based on the act establishing the violation of this section; or
- 21 (2) a violation of § 3–601 of this subtitle involving an act of abuse separate  
22 from sexual abuse under this section.

### 23 Article – Criminal Procedure

24 11–723.

25 (a) Except where a term of natural life without the possibility of parole is imposed,  
26 a sentence for the following persons shall include a term of lifetime sexual offender  
27 supervision:

28 (1) a person who is a sexually violent predator;

1 (2) a person who has been convicted of a violation of:

2 (i) § 3-303 or § 3-304 of the Criminal Law Article; or

3 (ii) § 3-305 or [§ 3-306(a)(1) or (2)] **§ 3-306** of the Criminal Law  
4 Article as the sections existed before October 1, 2017;

5 (3) a person who has been convicted of a violation of § 3-309 or § 3-310 of  
6 the Criminal Law Article, § 3-311 of the Criminal Law Article as the section existed before  
7 October 1, 2017, or an attempt to commit a violation of [§ 3-306(a)(1) or (2)] **§ 3-306** of the  
8 Criminal Law Article as the section existed before October 1, 2017;

9 (4) a person who has been convicted of a violation of § 3-602 of the Criminal  
10 Law Article [involving a child under the age of 12 years];

11 (5) a person who is required to register under § 11-704(c) of this subtitle;  
12 and

13 (6) a person who has been convicted more than once arising out of separate  
14 incidents of a crime that requires registration under this subtitle.

15 (b) Except where a term of natural life without the possibility of parole is imposed,  
16 a sentence for a violation of § 3-307(a)(1) or (2) of the Criminal Law Article may include a  
17 term of lifetime sexual offender supervision.

18 (c) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the term of  
19 lifetime sexual offender supervision imposed on a person for a crime committed on or after  
20 October 1, 2010, shall:

21 (i) be a term of life; and

22 (ii) commence on the expiration of the later of any term of  
23 imprisonment, probation, parole, or mandatory supervision.

24 (2) For a person who is required to register under § 11-704(c) of this  
25 subtitle, the term of lifetime sexual offender supervision imposed for an act committed on  
26 or after October 1, 2010, shall:

27 (i) commence when the person's obligation to register commences;  
28 and

29 (ii) expire when the person's obligation to register expires, unless the  
30 juvenile court:

31 1. finds after a hearing that there is a compelling reason for  
32 the supervision to continue; and

1                                   2.       orders the supervision to continue for a specified period of  
2 time.

3           (d)   (1)   For a sentence that includes a term of lifetime sexual offender  
4 supervision, the sentencing court, or juvenile court in the case of a person who is required  
5 to register under § 11–704(c) of this subtitle, shall impose special conditions of lifetime  
6 sexual offender supervision on the person at the time of sentencing, or imposition of the  
7 registration requirement in juvenile court, and advise the person of the length, conditions,  
8 and consecutive nature of that supervision.

9                               (2)   Before imposing special conditions, the sentencing court or juvenile  
10 court shall order:

11                                   (i)   a presentence investigation in accordance with § 6–112 of the  
12 Correctional Services Article; and

13                                   (ii)   for a sentence for a violation of § 3–307(a)(1) or (2) of the Criminal  
14 Law Article, a risk assessment of the person conducted by a sexual offender treatment  
15 provider.

16                               (3)   The conditions of lifetime sexual offender supervision may include:

17                                   (i)   monitoring through global positioning satellite tracking or  
18 equivalent technology;

19                                   (ii)   where appropriate and feasible, restricting a person from living  
20 in proximity to or loitering near schools, family child care homes, child care centers, and  
21 other places used primarily by minors;

22                                   (iii)   restricting a person from obtaining employment or from  
23 participating in an activity that would bring the person into contact with minors;

24                                   (iv)   requiring a person to participate in a sexual offender treatment  
25 program;

26                                   (v)   prohibiting a person from using illicit drugs or alcohol;

27                                   (vi)   authorizing a parole and probation agent to access the person's  
28 personal computer to check for material relating to sexual relations with minors;

29                                   (vii)   requiring a person to take regular polygraph examinations;

30                                   (viii)   prohibiting a person from contacting specific individuals or  
31 categories of individuals; and

32                                   (ix)   any other conditions deemed appropriate by the sentencing court

1 or juvenile court.

2 (4) The sentencing court or juvenile court may adjust the special conditions  
3 of lifetime sexual offender supervision, in consultation with the person's sexual offender  
4 management team.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to  
6 apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or  
7 application to any conviction before the effective date of this Act.

8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
9 October 1, 2021.
