3 **Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2021,**
4 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015,**
5 **2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, and 2020**

6 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~One Billion,~~
7 ~~One Hundred Seven Million, Four Hundred Twenty Seven Thousand Dollars~~
8 ~~(\$1,107,427,000)~~ One Billion, Six Million, Three Hundred Seventy Thousand, Six
9 Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$1,006,370,620), the proceeds to be used for certain
10 necessary building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion,
11 replacement, and capital equipment purchases of the State, for acquiring certain real
12 estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other
13 organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to certain
14 requirements that certain matching funds be provided and expended by certain
15 dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan;
16 imposing a certain tax on all assessable property in the State; requiring that certain
17 grantees convey certain easements under certain circumstances to the Maryland
18 Historical Trust; providing that the proceeds of certain loans must be expended or
19 encumbered by a certain date; authorizing the Board of Public Works, under certain
20 circumstances, to approve certain appropriations, notwithstanding certain technical
21 differences; authorizing certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital
22 budgets and bond loans to be expended for other public projects; altering certain
23 requirements for certain programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans;
24 reducing prior authorizations of State Debt; requiring that certain projects be
25 constructed at certain locations; adding, altering, and repealing certain
26 requirements for certain appropriations; specifying the use of certain project funds;

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
11 That:

12 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
13 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
14 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2021 in the total principal amount of ~~\$1,107,427,000~~
15 \$1,006,370,620. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State
16 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and
17 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 and 8–131.2 of the
18 State Finance and Procurement Article.

19 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a
20 single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

21 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and
22 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the
23 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on
24 the books of the Comptroller and expended on approval by the Board of Public Works, for
25 the following public purposes, including any applicable architects’ and engineers’ fees:
