SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General Assembly that Maryland Education Enterprise Consortium contract agreements are encouraged to include options for connectivity, hardware, software, maintenance of physical equipment, and technical support resources.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That each local school system shall use federal funds provided in the federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (H.R. 133) to increase the target per pupil foundation amount under § 5–202(a)(13)(v)2 of the Education Article, as enacted by this Act, in fiscal year 2022 before using any local funds.
