 make available to certain women feminine hygiene products in a certain amount;
 prohibiting local health departments and community action agencies from requiring
 payment for certain feminine hygiene products; defining a certain term; and

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1 IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE WOMAN OBTAINING THE 2 FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS.

3 (2) A COMMUNITY ACTION AGENCY MAY NOT REQUIRE PAYMENT FOR 4 THE FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS MADE AVAILABLE UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF 5 THIS SUBSECTION.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2021.
