BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Alcoholic Beverages Section 32-102 Annotated Code of Maryland (2016 Volume and 2020 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Alcoholic Beverages Section 32–1003 and 32–2004(a) Annotated Code of Maryland (2016 Volume and 2020 Supplement)

on Sunday, from 10 a.m. to midnight.
