CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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- 2 Task Force to Review and Update the Maryland Recycling Act on Recycling
 3 Policy and Recycling and Waste Systems in Maryland
 - FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Review and Update the Maryland Recycling Act on Recycling Policy and Recycling and Waste Systems in Maryland; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Review and Update the Maryland Recycling Act on Recycling Policy and Recycling and Waste Systems in Maryland.
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 15 That:
- 16 (a) There is a Task Force to Review and Update the Maryland Recycling Act on Recycling Policy and Recycling and Waste Systems in Maryland.

20 21 22 23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2021. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year <u>and 6 months</u> and, at the end of June 30, 2022 <u>December 31, 2022</u> , this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
