A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2	Workgroup to Study Partial Expungement	
$3 \\ 4 \\ 5 \\ 6 \\ 7 \\ 8 \\ 9 \\ 10$	FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup to Study Partial Expungement; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Workgroup to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Workgroup to submit a report to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the Workgroup to Study Partial Expungement.

13	(a)	There is a Workgroup to Study Partial Expungement.

3 (c) The Workgroup shall elect a chair from among its members.

4 (d) The Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and Victim Services shall 5 provide staff for the Workgroup.

- 6 (e) A member of the Workgroup:

(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but

8 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 9 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

10 (f) The Workgroup shall study and develop a plan and legislative 11 recommendations for enabling the expungement of criminal charges that are currently not 12 eligible for expungement because of the requirements of § 10–107 of the Criminal Procedure 13 Article.

14 (g) On or before January 5, 2022, the Workgroup shall report its plan and 15 legislative recommendations to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the 16 State Government Article.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 18 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of public health or safety, has been 19 passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each 20 of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. 21 It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 6 months from the date it is enacted and, 22 at the end of the 1-year and 6-month period, this Act, with no further action required by 23 the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
