BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 14 **Article – Transportation** 15 21 - 803. 16 (a) (1)Except as provided in [paragraph (3)] PARAGRAPHS (3) AND (4) of this 17 subsection, if, on the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation, a local authority 18 determines that any maximum speed limit specified in this subtitle is greater or less than 19 reasonable or safe under existing conditions on any part of a highway in its jurisdiction, it 20 may establish a reasonable and safe maximum speed limit for that part of the highway, 21which may:

Decrease the limit at an intersection;

Increase the limit in an urban district to not more than 50 miles
