20	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
21	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) (1) 2 "Speed monitoring system" means a device with one or more motor 3 vehicle sensors producing recorded images of motor vehicles traveling at speeds at least 12 miles per hour above the posted speed limit. 4 5 (b) A speed monitoring system may not be used in a local jurisdiction 6 under this section unless its use is authorized by the governing body of the local jurisdiction 7 by local law enacted after reasonable notice and a public hearing. 8 An ordinance or resolution adopted by the governing body of a (v) 9 local jurisdiction under this paragraph shall provide that, if the local jurisdiction moves or places a mobile or stationary speed monitoring system to or at a location where a speed 10 11 monitoring system had not previously been moved or placed, the local jurisdiction may not 12 issue a citation for a violation recorded by that speed monitoring system: 13 1. Until signage isinstalled in accordance with 14 subparagraph (vii) of this paragraph; and 15 2. For at least the first 15 calendar days after the signage is installed. 16 17 (vi) This section applies to a violation of this subtitle recorded by a 18 speed monitoring system that meets the requirements of this subsection and has been 19 placed: 20 1. In Montgomery County, on a highway in a residential 21district, as defined in § 21–101 of this title, with a maximum posted speed limit of 35 miles 22per hour, which speed limit was established using generally accepted traffic engineering 23practices; 242. In a school zone with a posted speed limit of at least 20 25miles per hour; or 26 3. In Prince George's County: 27 Subject to subparagraph (vii) of this paragraph, on Α. Maryland Route 210 (Indian Head Highway); [or] 28 29 В. - 2 (viii) Before activating a speed monitoring system, the local 3 jurisdiction shall: 4 1. Publish notice of the location of the speed monitoring 5 system on its website and in a newspaper of general circulation in the jurisdiction; 6 2. Ensure that each sign that designates a school zone is 7 proximate to a sign that: 8 A. Indicates that speed monitoring systems are in use in the 9 school zone; and 10 Is in accordance with the manual for and the specifications 11 for a uniform system of traffic control devices adopted by the State Highway Administration 12 under § 25–104 of this article; 13 With regard to a speed monitoring system established on 14 Maryland Route 210 (Indian Head Highway) OR ON MARYLAND ROUTE 382 (CROOM ROAD) in Prince George's County or based on proximity to an institution of higher 15 16 education under subparagraph (vi)3 of this paragraph, ensure that all speed limit signs 17 approaching and within the segment of highway on which the speed monitoring system is located include signs that: 18 19 A. Are in accordance with the manual and specifications for a uniform system of traffic control devices adopted by the State Highway Administration 2021under § 25–104 of this article; and 22 Indicate that a speed monitoring system is in use; and В. 23With regard to a speed monitoring system placed on 24Maryland Route 210 (Indian Head Highway) in Prince George's County, ensure that each 25 sign that indicates that a speed monitoring system is in use is proximate to a device that 26 displays a real-time posting of the speed at which a driver is traveling. 27 (c) (1)Unless the driver of the motor vehicle received a citation from a police 28 officer at the time of the violation, the owner or, in accordance with subsection (f)(4) of this 29 section, the driver of a motor vehicle is subject to a civil penalty if the motor vehicle is 30 recorded by a speed monitoring system while being operated in violation of this subtitle. 31 (2)A civil penalty under this subsection may not exceed \$40.
- 33 (i) A uniform citation form consistent with subsection (d)(1) of this 34 section and § 7–302 of the Courts Article; and

- 1 (ii) A civil penalty, which shall be indicated on the citation, to be paid 2 by persons who choose to prepay the civil penalty without appearing in District Court.
- 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 October 1, 2021.
