## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Community College Tuition and Residency Waivers – Funding

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor, beginning in a certain fiscal year, to include in 4 the annual State budget for the Maryland Higher Education Commission a General  $\mathbf{5}$ Fund appropriation of a certain amount to fund certain community college tuition 6 and residency waivers; requiring the Commission to distribute the appropriation to 7 each community college board of trustees based on the number of qualifying students 8 enrolled in each community college in proportion to the total number of qualifying 9 students, as determined by the Commission; requiring the Commission to adopt certain regulations or guidelines; defining a certain term; and generally relating to 1011 community college funding for State-mandated tuition and residency waivers.
