# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Education – Maryland High School Diploma – Civics Test Requirement

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a student to take and achieve a passing score on a certain 4 civics test to graduate from a public high school on or after a certain date; requiring  $\mathbf{5}$ the State Board of Education, on or before the first day of a certain school year, to 6 determine the means of providing each high school student an opportunity to take a 7 certain civics test; requiring a student to correctly answer at least a certain 8 percentage of the questions on a certain civics test to achieve a passing score; 9 authorizing a student to repeat taking a certain civics test until the student achieves a passing score; requiring certain county boards of education to indicate on the 10 11 official educational record of each high school student whether the student has 12complied with certain requirements; requiring, on or after a certain date, certain 13 alternative requirements provided by the Maryland Department of Labor for 14obtaining a Maryland high school diploma to include taking and achieving a certain 15passing score on a certain civics test; requiring, on or after a certain date, an 16 individual to take and receive a passing score on a certain civics test to qualify for a 17Maryland high school diploma by examination; and generally relating to the 18 implementation of a civics test requirement for a Maryland high school diploma.

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1 (b) An individual is not subject to the requirements of subsection (a)(3) of this 2 section if the individual participates in a GED Option Program administered by the State 3 Department of Education that creates a pathway to a high school diploma by examination 4 for currently enrolled high school English language learner students under the age of 21 5 years who have experienced interrupted education and have a lower level of English 6 proficiency than their peers.

7 (c) The Department shall offer examinations to individuals who are pursuing a 8 high school diploma under this subtitle at least twice each year at places throughout the 9 State that are reasonably convenient for the applicants.

- 10 (d) The examination shall:
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- (1) be offered in appropriate high school subject areas; and

12 (2) be of a comprehensive nature as determined by the State Board of 13 Education.

14 (e) An individual who fails an examination may repeat taking the examination.

15 (f) A current member of the armed forces is exempt from the residency 16 requirement in subsection (a)(2) of this section and may earn a Maryland high school 17 diploma by achieving a passing score on the examination offered under subsection (c) of 18 this section.

19 (g) The diploma shall be awarded in accordance with the regulations adopted by 20 the Secretary and the State Board of Education.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 22 1, 2021.
