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1 AN ACT concerning

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Behavioral Health Services and Voluntary Placement Agreements – Children and Young Adults – Report Modifications

- FOR the purpose of requiring that the Director of the Behavioral Health Administration's 4 5 annual report on behavioral health services for children and young adults in the 6 State include certain information relating to outpatient and substance-related 7 disorders program services by children and young adults and behavioral health 8 services provided through telehealth; altering the scope of certain data required to 9 be included in the report; requiring that certain data in the report be grouped by race 10 and ethnicity; requiring that the Social Services Administration's annual report on 11 voluntary placement agreements for children and young adults include certain 12 information relating to agreements requested for certain children with a 13 developmental disability and the type of placement recommended for agreements 14 that were approved; making a technical correction; and generally relating to 15 behavioral health services and voluntary placement agreements for children and 16 young adults.
