4	FOR the purpose of establishing that a substantial loss of income due to a declared
5	catastrophic health emergency is an affirmative defense to certain eviction
6	proceedings for the failure to pay rent under certain circumstances; prohibiting a
7	court from entering a judgment for possession or repossession against a tenant if the
8	tenant can demonstrate a substantial loss of income under certain circumstances;
9	defining certain terms; providing for the application of this Act; making this Act an
10	emergency measure; and generally relating to eviction proceedings during
11	catastrophic health emergencies.

In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. 1 (a) 2 "Catastrophic health emergency" means a situation in which extensive loss of life or serious disability is threatened imminently because of exposure to a deadly agent. 3 "Deadly agent" means: 4 (c) anthrax, ebola, plague, smallpox, tularemia, or other bacterial, fungal, 5 6 rickettsial, or viral agent, biological toxin, or other biological agent capable of causing extensive loss of life or serious disability; 7 8 mustard gas, nerve gas, or other chemical agent capable of causing extensive loss of life or serious disability; or 9 10 (3)radiation at levels capable of causing extensive loss of life or serious 11 disability. 12 "Exposure to a deadly agent" means a threat to human health caused by the release, distribution, or transmission of a deadly agent in: 13 this State; or 14 (1) 15 another jurisdiction because of movement into the State of the deadly 16 agent or of individuals exposed to the deadly agent. 17 Article - Real Property SUBTITLE 9. - 8 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY DURING A CATASTROPHIC HEALTH 9 EMERGENCY.
- 10 (B) (1) A SUBSTANTIAL LOSS OF INCOME IS AN AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE TO
- 11 A COMPLAINT AGAINST A TENANT OF RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL, OR INDUSTRIAL
- 12 REAL PROPERTY FOR FAILURE TO PAY RENT.
- 13 (2) A COURT MAY NOT GIVE A JUDGMENT FOR POSSESSION OR
- 14 REPOSSESSION, OR ISSUE A WARRANT FOR RESTITUTION OF POSSESSION OR
- 15 REPOSSESSION OF RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL, OR INDUSTRIAL REAL PROPERTY
- 16 UNDER § 8-401 OR § 8-402.1 OF THIS TITLE IF THE TENANT CAN DEMONSTRATE TO
- 17 THE COURT, THROUGH DOCUMENTATION OR OTHER OBJECTIVELY VERIFIABLE
- 18 MEANS, THAT THE TENANT SUFFERED A SUBSTANTIAL LOSS OF INCOME.
- 19 (C) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, §§ 8–401
- 20 AND 8-402.1 OF THIS TITLE SHALL OTHERWISE REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT
- 21 DURING A DECLARED CATASTROPHIC HEALTH EMERGENCY.
- 22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- 23 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
- been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
- 25 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
- 26 enacted.
