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Election Law – Polling Sites – Firearms Prohibitions

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from carrying or displaying a firearm on certain premises or carrying or possessing a firearm within a certain number of feet of a polling site during an election, subject to a certain exception certain exceptions; establishing a certain civil penalty for a certain violation; defining a certain term;

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 Article – Election Law

- 4 16–903.
- 5 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a person may not attire or 6 equip an individual, or permit an individual to be attired or equipped, in a manner which 7 creates the appearance that the individual is performing an official or governmental 8 function in connection with an election, including:
- 9 (1) wearing a public or private law enforcement or security guard uniform;
- 10 (2) using an armband; or
- 11 (3) except as required by law or by regulation adopted by the State Board 12 in connection with ballot security activities, carrying or displaying a [gun] FIREARM, AS 13 **DEFINED IN § 16–904(A) OF THIS SUBTITLE,** or badge within 100 feet of a polling site on 14 election day.
- 15 (b) (1) A law enforcement officer or security guard who is on duty or traveling 16 to or from duty may vote while wearing a uniform.
- 17 (2) A law enforcement officer who is performing an official governmental function may wear a uniform at a polling site.
- 19 (c) A person who violates this section is subject to the civil penalty specified under 20 § 16–1002 of this title.

- 22 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, "FIREARM" MEANS A WEAPON THAT EXPELS, IS
 23 DESIGNED TO EXPEL, OR MAY READILY BE CONVERTED TO EXPEL A PROJECTILE BY
 24 THE ACTION OF AN EXPLOSIVE.
- 25 (2) "FIREARM" INCLUDES AN ANTIQUE FIREARM, A HANDGUN, A 26 RIFLE, A SHOTGUN, A SHORT-BARRELED RIFLE, A SHORT-BARRELED SHOTGUN, A 27 STARTER GUN, OR ANY OTHER FIREARM, WHETHER LOADED OR UNLOADED.
- 28 (B) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN <u>SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION AND</u> § 29 16–903 OF THIS SUBTITLE, A PERSON MAY NOT:
- 30 (1) CARRY OR DISPLAY A FIREARM ON THE PREMISES OF A PRIVATELY
 31 OR PUBLICLY OWNED BUILDING BEING USED AS A POLLING SITE DURING AN
 32 ELECTION, INCLUDING IN A PARKING LOT; OR

3 4	(C) (1) AN INDIVIDUAL IS NOT IN VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION IF THE INDIVIDUAL IS:
5 6	(I) A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER IN THE REGULAR COURSE OF THE OFFICER'S DUTY; OR
7	(II) AN OFF-DUTY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, IF:
8 9	1. THE OFFICER IS DISPLAYING THE OFFICER'S BADGE OR CREDENTIAL; AND
10 11	2. THE WEAPON CARRIED OR POSSESSED BY THE OFFICER IS CONCEALED.

18 19	(3) (III) THE INDIVIDUAL IS TRANSFERRING THE FIREARM TO THE INDIVIDUAL'S RESIDENCE OR VEHICLE WITHIN 100 FEET OF A POLLING PLACE.
20 21	$\frac{(C)}{(D)}$ A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO THE CIVIL PENALTY SPECIFIED UNDER § 16–1002 OF THIS TITLE.

23	A person who violates § 16–201(a)(6) or (7) [or], § 16–903, OR § 16–904 of this title

without knowing that the act is illegal shall pay a civil penalty and have the matter adjudicated in accordance with § 13–604 of this article.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2021.
