1 (I) THE CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH A NURSING 2 ASSISTANT, AS A CONDITION OF RENEWAL, IS REQUIRED TO COMPLETE EITHER AN 3 APPROVED NURSING ASSISTANT TRAINING PROGRAM OR AN APPROVED NURSING 4 ASSISTANT REFRESHER TRAINING PROGRAM; AND

5 (II) THE NUMBER OF DIDACTIC INSTRUCTION HOURS AND 6 CLINICAL TRAINING HOURS THE NURSING ASSISTANT TRAINING PROGRAM OR 7 NURSING ASSISTANT REFRESHER TRAINING PROGRAM MUST HAVE TO BE 8 APPROVED.

9 (2) REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS 10 SUBSECTION MUST BE CONSISTENT WITH FEDERAL LAW.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 October 1, 2021.
