# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Electricity and Gas – Energy Suppliers – Supply Offers

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Public Service Commission, on or before a certain date, 4 to establish an administrative process to approve supply offers for electricity or gas  $\mathbf{5}$ for households in the State that receive energy assistance through a program 6 administered by the Office of Home Energy Programs; prohibiting, beginning on a 7 certain date, approved supply offers from offering to provide electricity or gas to 8 certain households, renewing a certain contract, or charging a certain fee; requiring, 9 beginning on a certain date, approved supply offers to include a certain commitment 10 to charge certain rates for certain customers; prohibiting a third-party retail 11 supplier whose offer is not approved by the Commission from receiving certain funds 12or charging a certain customer under certain circumstances; authorizing the Office 13 of Home Energy Programs to allocate funding toward supplier charges as part of 14 arrearage assistance for certain contracts; requiring the Commission to publish a 15certain annual report on or before a certain date; requiring the Commission to create 16certain test cases to verify certain supplier billing practices; and generally relating 17to electricity and natural gas supply.

2 (A) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2022, THE COMMISSION SHALL BY 3 REGULATION OR ORDER ESTABLISH AN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCESS TO APPROVE 4 SUPPLY OFFERS FOR ELECTRICITY OR GAS FOR HOUSEHOLDS IN THE STATE THAT 5 RECEIVE ENERGY ASSISTANCE THROUGH A PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE 6 OFFICE OF HOME ENERGY PROGRAMS.

7 (B) (1) BEGINNING JULY 1, 2022, AN APPROVED SUPPLY OFFER MAY NOT 8 OFFER TO:

9 (I) PROVIDE ELECTRICITY OR GAS TO HOUSEHOLDS IN THE 10 STATE THAT HAVE RECEIVED ENERGY ASSISTANCE DURING THE PREVIOUS FISCAL 11 YEAR;

12 (II) RENEW A CONTRACT TO PROVIDE ELECTRICITY OR GAS TO 13 HOUSEHOLDS IN THE STATE THAT ENROLL THE HOUSEHOLD IN AN ENERGY 14 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM UNLESS THE COMMISSION APPROVES THE SUPPLY OFFER; 15 OR

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(III) CHARGE A TERMINATION FEE.

17 (2) AN APPROVED SUPPLY OFFER FROM A THIRD-PARTY RETAIL 18 SUPPLIER SHALL INCLUDE A COMMITMENT TO CHARGING AT OR BELOW THE 19 STANDARD OFFER SERVICE RATE OR GAS COMMODITY RATE FOR CUSTOMERS 20 RECEIVING ENERGY ASSISTANCE.

21 (3) IF A THIRD–PARTY RETAIL SUPPLIER'S OFFER IS NOT APPROVED 22 BY THE COMMISSION, THE THIRD–PARTY RETAIL SUPPLIER MAY NOT:

23 (I) RECEIVE FUNDS FROM AN ENERGY PROGRAM 24 ADMINISTERED BY THE OFFICE OF HOME ENERGY PROGRAMS; OR

25(II) CHARGE A CUSTOMER RECEIVING ASSISTANCE FROM AN26ENERGY PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE OFFICE OF HOME ENERGY PROGRAMS.

(C) THE OFFICE OF HOME ENERGY PROGRAMS MAY ALLOCATE FUNDING
 TOWARD SUPPLIER CHARGES AS PART OF ARREARAGE ASSISTANCE FOR CONTRACTS
 THAT PRECEDED A CUSTOMER'S APPLICATION FOR ENERGY ASSISTANCE FROM THE
 OFFICE OF HOME ENERGY PROGRAMS.

31(D)(1)ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSION32SHALL PUBLISH A REPORT ON THE COMMISSION'S WEBSITE THAT INCLUDES:

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1 **(I)** THE NAMES AND THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SUPPLIERS THAT  $\mathbf{2}$ APPLIED FOR APPROVAL TO SELL TO ENERGY ASSISTANCE HOUSEHOLDS; 3 **(II)** THE NAMES AND THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SUPPLIERS THAT WERE APPROVED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION; 4  $\mathbf{5}$ (III) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SUPPLIERS THAT WERE REJECTED, 6 IF ANY; 7 (IV) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF ENERGY ASSISTANCE HOUSEHOLDS 8 THAT WERE SIGNED UP WITH A THIRD-PARTY SUPPLIER; 9 THE TOTAL NUMBER OF "NEW ENROLLMENT" REQUESTS **(V)** 10 FOR ENERGY ASSISTANCE HOUSEHOLDS THAT WERE DENIED BECAUSE THE 11 SUPPLIER WAS NOT APPROVED; AND 12(VI) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF ENERGY ASSISTANCE HOUSEHOLDS 13 THAT FILED COMPLAINTS ABOUT THEIR THIRD-PARTY SUPPLIER. 14(2) THE COMMISSION SHALL SEND A COPY OF THE REPORT TO THE OFFICE OF PEOPLE'S COUNSEL, THE OFFICE OF HOME ENERGY PROGRAMS, AND, 15SUBJECT TO § 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE SENATE 16FINANCE COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE ECONOMIC MATTERS COMMITTEE. 17EACH YEAR THE COMMISSION SHALL CREATE TEST CASES FOR NEW 18 **(E)** 19 ENROLLMENTS THAT SHALL BE RUN THROUGH EACH UTILITY'S BILLING AND 20ENROLLMENT SYSTEM ON A QUARTERLY BASIS TO VERIFY THAT SUPPLIERS ON THE 21APPROVED LIST ARE CORRECTLY CHARGING HOUSEHOLDS THAT RECEIVE ENERGY 22ASSISTANCE.
