A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Economic Development – Maryland Technology Development Corporation – Alterations

4 FOR the purpose of altering the title of the Executive Director of the Maryland Technology Development Corporation to be the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation; $\mathbf{5}$ 6 altering the membership of the Board of the Maryland Technology Development 7 Corporation; altering certain provisions on the removal of a Board member; altering 8 the quorum requirement for the Board; making conforming changes; authorizing the 9 publisher of the Annotated Code of Maryland to make certain changes in a certain 10 manner; providing for the terms of certain members of the Board appointed under 11 this Act; and generally relating to the Maryland Technology Development Corporation. 12

3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the new members 4 of the Board of Directors of the Maryland Technology Development Corporation appointed 5 by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, respectively, under § 6 10–403(b)(3) of the Economic Development Article, as enacted by this Act, shall expire as 7 follows:

- 8 (1) the term of one member appointed by each officer shall expire in 2023; 9 and
- 10 (2) the term of one member appointed by each officer shall expire in 2025.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July1, 2021.

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
