A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Task Force on Higher Education Students With Chronic Health Conditions

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on Higher Education Students With 4 Chronic Health Conditions; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the $\mathbf{5}$ Task Force; prohibiting a member from receiving certain compensation, but 6 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to 7 obtain data on, study, and make recommendations regarding certain matters; authorizing the Task Force to use certain resources to carry out its duties; requiring 8 9 the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 10 General Assembly on or before a certain date; requiring the Maryland Department 11 of Health and the Maryland Higher Education Commission to make the report to the Governor and the General Assembly available to the public; providing for the 1213termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force on Higher Education Students With Chronic Health Conditions. 14

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,16 That:

17 (a) There is a Task Force on Higher Education Students With Chronic Health18 Conditions.

19 (b) The Maryland Department of Health jointly with the Maryland Higher 20 Education Commission shall appoint members of the Task Force, including members that 21 are:

 - (i) institutions of higher education, including community colleges,

$\begin{array}{c} 14\\ 15\\ 16\end{array}$	(c) The Secretary of Health, or the Secretary's designee, and the chairperson of the Maryland Higher Education Commission, or the chairperson's designee, shall serve as cochairs of the Task Force.
17 18	(d) The Maryland Department of Health and the Maryland Higher Education Commission may provide staff for the Task Force.
19	(e) A member of the Task Force:
20	(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but

23	(f) The Task Force shall:
$\begin{array}{c} 24\\ 25\\ 26\end{array}$	(1) obtain and study existing data, as is publicly available, on undergraduate and graduate students with chronic health conditions at institutions of higher education in the State, including data on:
27	(i) the demographics of students with chronic health conditions;

30	(iii) challenges faced by students with chronic health conditions;

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1 (iv) existing policies at institutions of higher education addressing 2 the rights and needs of students with chronic health conditions; and

3 (v) available programs and resources at institutions of higher 4 education for students with chronic health conditions; and

make recommendations on:

6 (i) enhancing and continuing systematic data collection on students 7 with chronic health conditions;

8 (ii) eliminating existing challenges and accommodating the needs of 9 students with chronic health conditions to ensure they receive reasonable, effective, and 10 appropriate higher education in the State; and

11 (iii) meeting the long-term resource demands of and the need for 12 programs for students with chronic health conditions.

13 (g) The Task Force may use State, federal, and academic resources to carry out 14 the Task Force's duties under subsection (f) of this section, including obtaining policies on 15 accommodating students with chronic health conditions from institutions of higher 16 education within the State or in other states.

(h) (1) On or before December 31, 2022, the Task Force shall report its findings
and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State
Government Article, the General Assembly.

20 (2) The Maryland Department of Health and the Maryland Higher 21 Education Commission shall make the report submitted under this subsection available to 22 the public.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
1, 2021. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2023,
this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and
