1 (f) The Fund may be used only to provide grants to eligible counties to establish 2 or improve pretrial services programs.

3 (g) (1) The State Treasurer shall invest the money of the Fund in the same 4 manner as other State money may be invested.

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(2) Any interest earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the Fund.

6 (h) Expenditures from the Fund may be made only in accordance with the State 7 budget.

8 (i) The accounts and transactions of the Fund shall be subject to audit by the 9 Legislative Auditor as provided in § 2–1220 of the State Government Article.

(1) establish procedures for eligible counties to apply for and receive grantsfrom the Fund; and

(d) An eligible county that receives a grant from the Fund shall submit to theExecutive Director proof of the expenditure of the grant funds.

(e) Money distributed under this subtitle shall be used to supplement and not
supplant any other funding for the establishment or improvement of a pretrial services
program.
