BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article - State Government Section 9-957 Annotated Code of Maryland (2014 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - State Government 9 - 957(a) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. (1) (2) "Eligible veteran" means an individual who: (i) served on active duty in: the armed forces of the United States: 1.



"SUPPORT DOG" MEANS A DOG THAT SERVES AS AN EMOTIONAL 1 **(9)** 2 SUPPORT OR THERAPY ANIMAL THAT A MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL, WITHIN THE 3 MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL'S SCOPE OF PRACTICE, HAS DETERMINED PROVIDES 4 BENEFIT FOR AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A SENSORY, PSYCHIATRIC, INTELLECTUAL, OR 5 OTHER MENTAL DISABILITY. 6 (10) "THERAPY HORSE" **INCLUDES** Α HORSE **DETERMINED** 7 APPROPRIATE FOR INTERACTIONS WITH VETERANS BY A STABLE LICENSED BY THE STATE THAT: 8 IS A PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION OF THERAPEUTIC 9 (I)HORSEMANSHIP, INTERNATIONAL (PATH, INTL.) There is a Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program in the Department. 15 (b) 16 (c) The purposes of the Program are to: 17 (1) refer eligible veterans who inquire about participation in the Program to one or more nonprofit training entities; 18 19 provide additional funding mechanisms to assist veterans participating (2)20 in the Program; 21encourage successful Program participants to assist in outreach and (3)22referral of other eligible veterans who could benefit from participation in the Program; 23 assist in the reduction of the Maryland veteran suicide rate; and **(4)** 24identify potential capital projects and services to facilitate more 25services for veterans in the State. 26 (d) (1) The Department shall select at least one nonprofit training entity to: 27 (i) implement a training or therapy protocol for the purposes of the 28 Program that will teach each Program participant methodologies, strategies, and 29 techniques for: 30 1. partnering with service dogs or support dogs; or

1 select qualified Program participants from those eligible (ii) 2 veterans referred to the nonprofit entity under the Program: 3 (iii) select an appropriate service dog, support dog, or therapy horse, as applicable, for each Program participant; 4 5 facilitate each Program participant's training or therapy using 6 the nonprofit training entity's training or therapy protocol; and 7 unless the nonprofit training entity uses trained therapy horses, partner each successful Program participant with the service dog or support dog on the 8 9 Program participant's successful completion of the nonprofit training entity's training 10 protocol. To be eligible for selection under paragraph (1) of this subsection, a 11 (2)12 nonprofit entity must: 13 (i) be based in the State: 14 (ii) serve the needs of the veteran population in the State; and 15 generate its own revenue and reinvest the proceeds of that revenue in the growth and development of its programs. 16 17 A nonprofit training entity may disqualify a Program participant from (e) participation in the Program if the nonprofit training entity determines that the Program 18 participant's involvement in the Program: 19 20 presents a danger to the Program participant's mental or (i) 21physical well-being; 22has caused or may potentially cause harm to others, an animal, (ii) 23or property; 24 (iii) presents a danger to the service dog's, support dog's, or therapy horse's mental or physical well-being; or 2526 does not meet the training requirement of the nonprofit. (iv) 27 (2)A Program participant may discontinue involvement in the Program for 28any reason. 29 (f) (1) There is a Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program Fund.

The Department shall use revenue from the Fund to pay a nonprofit

Revenue from the Fund may be used only to pay: 1 (3) 2 a nonprofit training entity; and (i) 3 (ii) administrative costs of the Program. 4 (4) The Secretary, or the Secretary's designee, shall administer the Fund. 5 The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § (i) 6 7–302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article. 7 (ii) The State Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately, and the 8 Comptroller shall account for the Fund. 9 The Fund consists of: (6) 10 (i) revenue collected by the Department in the form of donations to 11 the Program; 12(ii) money appropriated in the State budget to the Fund; and 13 (iii) any other money from any other source accepted for the benefit of the Fund. 14 The State Treasurer shall invest the money of the Fund in the same 15 (7)16 manner as other State money may be invested. 17 (8)Any interest earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the General Fund of the State. 18 19 (9)Expenditures from the Fund may be made only in accordance with the 20 State budget. 21Money expended from the Fund is supplemental to and is not intended (10)22to take the place of funding that otherwise would be appropriated for the Program. 23For the purpose of implementing this section, the Department may (g) (1) 24accept gifts or grants for donation to the Fund. 25On or before October 1, 2018, and each October 1 thereafter, the (2)26 Department shall post and maintain on its website a list containing the names of all 27persons who have donated to the Fund in the previous year and have authorized the 28 Department to publish their names on its website. 29 The Department shall adopt regulations to implement this section, including
