FOR the purpose of expanding eligibility for a Maryland Community College Promise 4 Scholarship to an applicant who enrolls in a certain continuing education course and  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 an individual who is unemployed or laid off under certain circumstances; providing 7 that a certain applicant is not required to meet a certain grade point average 8 requirement to be eligible for the Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship 9 under certain circumstances: requiring the Governor to include a certain amount in 10 the State budget for a certain fiscal year in addition to the amount that is required for Maryland Community College Promise Scholarships; and generally relating to 11 the Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship. 12

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, In addition to the amount the 14 Governor is required to include in the budget bill for fiscal year 2023 for Maryland 15 Community College Promise Scholarship awards under § 18–3605 of the Education Article, 16 the Governor shall include in the budget bill for fiscal year 2023 a general fund 17 appropriation of \$3,500,000.
