## Neighborhood Business Development Program – Food Desert Projects – Business Retention

- FOR the purpose of expanding the purposes of the Neighborhood Business Development 4 5 Program to include retaining certain businesses and enterprises in food deserts and 6 certain areas that serve food deserts; increasing the maximum amount of a certain 7 small loan that may be provided to an approved entity for assistance in providing or 8 maintaining access to healthy food in certain food deserts; authorizing the 9 Department of Housing and Community Development to provide certain loans to an 10 approved entity for certain operating costs; requiring the Department to forgive a 11 certain loan after a certain number of years under certain circumstances; specifying 12 that certain food desert projects may serve urban or rural food deserts; altering a 13 certain definition; and generally relating to the Neighborhood Business Development Program and food desert projects. 14
