- 2 (a) A Class C per diem beer, wine, and liquor license entitles the license holder to 3 exercise any of the privileges conferred by this class of license:
- 4 (1) for the use of a person holding an entertainment event that is conducted 5 by a club;
- 6 (2) at the place described in the license; and
- 7 (3) for a period not exceeding 7 consecutive days.
- 8 (b) Alcoholic beverages sold under a Class C per diem beer, wine, and liquor 9 license shall be purchased by the license holder from a retail dealer.

- 11 This title applies only in Garrett County.

- 13 (b) There is a Class C (club and organization) beer, wine, and liquor license.
- 14 (g) [(1)] The annual license fees are:
- 15 [(i)] (1) \$1,500 for a 6-day license; and
- 16 [(ii)] **(2)** \$1,750 for a 7-day license.
- 17 **[**(2) The Board shall charge a one—time issuing fee for a new license in an 18 amount equal to the annual license fee.]

- 21 (g) The annual license fee is \$205 [in addition to a one—time issuing fee for a new 22 license of \$205].
