The Program:

5 (xv) Shall provide, subject to the limitations of the State budget, 6 mental health services appropriately delivered through telehealth to a patient in the 7 patient's home setting; [and]

8 (xvi) Beginning on January 1, 2021, shall provide, subject to the 9 limitations of the State budget and § 15–855(b)(2) of the Insurance Article, and as permitted by federal law, services for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated 10 with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome, 11 12including the use of intravenous immunoglobulin therapy, for eligible Program recipients, 13if pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections 14and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome are coded for billing and diagnosis 15purposes in accordance with § 15-855(d) of the Insurance Article; AND

16 (XVII) BEGINNING ON JANUARY 1, 2022, MAY NOT INCLUDE, 17 SUBJECT TO FEDERAL APPROVAL AND LIMITATIONS OF THE STATE BUDGET, A 18 FREQUENCY LIMITATION ON COVERED DENTAL PROPHYLAXIS CARE OR ORAL 19 HEALTH EXAMS THAT REQUIRES THE DENTAL PROPHYLAXIS CARE OR ORAL HEALTH 20 EXAMS TO BE PROVIDED AT AN INTERVAL GREATER THAN 120 DAYS WITHIN A PLAN 21 YEAR.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 23 October 1, 2021.

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
