

- 1 (3)Holds or has held a national certification in audiology from an (i) 2 organization if the organization is recognized by the Board and the qualifications for 3 certification meet the practice requirements established by the regulations adopted by the 4 Board;
- 5 Holds a current license to practice audiology in another state if (ii) 6 the Board determines that the state has requirements for licensure that are at least equivalent to the requirements of this State and meet the practice requirements 8 established under regulations adopted by the Board; or
