membership of the Procurement Improvement Council; repealing provisions of law
relating to the Council for the Procurement of Health, Educational, and Social
Services; declaring the intent of the General Assembly; and generally relating to the
Procurement Improvement Council for the Procurement of Health,
Educational, and Social Services.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General Assembly that a business, or representative of a business, participating in the Procurement Improvement Council, will not be favored in, disfavored in, or disqualified from the selection of contracts with, or eligibility for benefits from, the State on the grounds of the business's role in the Council.
