A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – Surplus Military Equipment – Prohibition on Purchase by Law**
3 **Enforcement Agencies**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain law enforcement agencies from receiving certain
5 equipment from a federal military surplus program; defining certain terms; and
6 generally relating to law enforcement agencies and the acquisition of equipment
7 from a federal military surplus program.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Public Safety**

17 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

18 (2) **“DESTRUCTIVE DEVICE” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 4–501 OF**
19 **THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE.**

20 (3) **“FIREARM SILENCER” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 5–621 OF**
21 **THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE.**

22 [(2)] (4) “Law enforcement agency” has the meaning stated in § 3–201 of

2 **[(3)] (5)** “Surplus program” means a program operated by the federal
3 government for the transfer of surplus military equipment to a law enforcement agency.

4 (b) On or before February 1 each year, the Department of State Police shall
5 submit a report on the acquisition of equipment by law enforcement agencies through
6 surplus programs within the preceding calendar year to the Governor and, in accordance
7 with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

8 (c) The Department of State Police shall include in a prominent location on its
9 public website a link to the Defense Logistics Agency’s report listing excess Department of
10 Defense property transfers to law enforcement agencies through the Law Enforcement
11 Support Office.

12 **(D) A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY MAY NOT RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING**
13 **EQUIPMENT FROM A SURPLUS PROGRAM:**

14 **(1) AN ARMORED OR WEAPONIZED:**

15 **(I) AIRCRAFT;**

16 **(II) DRONE; OR**

17 **(III) VEHICLE;**

18 **(2) A DESTRUCTIVE DEVICE;**

19 **(3) A FIREARM SILENCER; OR**

20 **(4) A GRENADE LAUNCHER.**

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
22 October 1, 2021.
