 $\mathbf{2}$ **[**(3)**] (5)** "Surplus program" means a program operated by the federal 3 government for the transfer of surplus military equipment to a law enforcement agency. 4 (b) On or before February 1 each year, the Department of State Police shall submit a report on the acquisition of equipment by law enforcement agencies through $\mathbf{5}$ surplus programs within the preceding calendar year to the Governor and, in accordance 6 7 with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly. 8 (c) The Department of State Police shall include in a prominent location on its 9 public website a link to the Defense Logistics Agency's report listing excess Department of 10 Defense property transfers to law enforcement agencies through the Law Enforcement 11 Support Office. 12**(**D**)** A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY MAY NOT RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING 13**EQUIPMENT FROM A SURPLUS PROGRAM:** (1) 14AN ARMORED OR WEAPONIZED: **(I)** 15AIRCRAFT; 16 **(II)** DRONE; OR 17(III) VEHICLE; (2) 18A DESTRUCTIVE DEVICE; 19 (3) A FIREARM SILENCER; OR 20(4) A GRENADE LAUNCHER. 21SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22October 1, 2021.

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
