A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

$\mathbf{2}$ State Lottery Fund – Maryland Humanities Council – Funding

- 3 FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of law requiring the Comptroller to pay from the Racing Special Fund a certain grant to a certain entity; requiring the 4 $\mathbf{5}$ Comptroller to pay a certain amount of money from the State Lottery Fund to a 6 certain entity to be used for certain purposes; and generally relating to the State 7 Lottery Fund and the Maryland Humanities Council.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. 18 19That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

6 (iii) \$150,000 to the Maryland Humanities Council for Maryland 7 History Day and other programming].

10 (b) (1) By the end of the month following collection, the Comptroller shall 11 deposit [or], cause to be deposited, **OR PAY**:

(i) into the Maryland Stadium Facilities Fund established under §
7–312 of the State Finance and Procurement Article from the money that remains in the
State Lottery Fund, after the distribution under subsection (a) of this section, an amount
not to exceed \$20,000,000 in any fiscal year;

(ii) after June 30, 2014, into the Maryland Veterans Trust Fund 10%
of the money that remains in the State Lottery Fund from the proceeds of sales of tickets
from instant ticket lottery machines by veterans' organizations under § 9–112(d) of this
subtitle, after the distribution under subsection (a) of this section;

(iii) after June 30, 2014, into the Baltimore City Public School Construction Financing Fund established under § 10–656 of the Economic Development Article the money that remains in the State Lottery Fund from the proceeds of all lotteries after the distributions under subsection (a) of this section and items (i) and (ii) of this paragraph, an amount equal to \$20,000,000 in each fiscal year that bonds are outstanding and unpaid, to be paid in two installments with at least \$10,000,000 paid no later than December 1 of each fiscal year;

(iv) after June 30, 2021, into the Racing and Community
Development Financing Fund established under § 10–657.2 of the Economic Development
Article from the money that remains in the State Lottery Fund, after the distribution under
subsection (a) of this section, an amount equal to \$17,000,000 in each fiscal year until the
bonds issued for a racing facility have matured; [and]

(V) AFTER JUNE 30, 2021, A GRANT TO THE MARYLAND
HUMANITIES COUNCIL FOR MARYLAND HISTORY DAY AND OTHER PROGRAMMING
FROM THE MONEY THAT REMAINS IN THE STATE LOTTERY FUND AFTER THE
DISTRIBUTIONS UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION AND ITEMS (I), (II), (III),

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1 AND (IV) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO \$150,000 IN EACH FISCAL 2 YEAR; AND

3 (v) into the General Fund of the State the money that remains in the 4 State Lottery Fund from the proceeds of all lotteries after the distributions under 5 subsection (a) of this section and items (i), (ii), [and] (iv), AND (V) of this paragraph.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 7 1, 2021.
